Metal Area MT-A is a free VST/AU/AAX plugin that models an iconic distortion pedal - Boss® MT-2™.

Our latest technology **Neural Hybrid Engine** was used to model this device with absolute perfection.



Windows

- **CPU:** Intel or AMD with SSE2 support
- **OS:** Windows 7 and newer
- **RAM:** 2GB
- **If using Pro Tools DAW:** 11 and newer

Mac

- **CPU:** Intel or AMD with SSE2 support
- **OS:** OS X 10.7 and newer
- **RAM:** 2GB
- **If using Pro Tools DAW:** 11 and newer



Stereo mode (1)

Activates separate processing of each channel. It works only on a stereo track.

Input gain (2)

Controls the signal strength at the plugin input.

Note: Please also check “**Recommendations for the “Volume Input” settings**” on the next page.

Quality (3)

Switches between 2x and 4x oversampling.

Level (4)

Controls the volume at the output of the pedal. Useful for matching the distortion level to the normal level when switching the effect on or off.

Dist (5)

Adjusts the amount of distortion.

EQ section (6)

- **High:** control the tone at high frequencies.
- **Low:** control the tone at low frequencies.
- **Middle:** boosts or cuts the frequency you set with the “**Mid freq**” knob.
- **Mid freq:** sets the frequency of the middle range knob from 200 Hz to 5 kHz.

Please note - below is just our recommendation. You can set it up differently, if you wish.

Play your stringed instrument as hard as you can - for example some power chords on lower (bass) strings. Now observe what signal is coming into your DAW. We recommend that you aim for -6 dB. It means that when you hit strings hard, the input meter in your DAW will sometimes peak at -6 dB. If you are getting too close to clipping (0 dB), turn down the gain knob of your audio interface's instrumental input. If you are hitting strings hard and cannot reach -6 dB, turn the gain knob up on your audio interface's instrumental input.

Once you find the optimal gain knob position, move on to setting up the Volume Input in Metal Area. Here are the recommended values:

1-2 for single-coil pickups

2-4 for low/mid-gain humbuckers

5-6 for high-gain humbuckers

Feel free to try other values if the recommended ones do not work for you.
